1. News

- a. **The 2024 Space Census is now open.** It's a national survey of the UK space workforce, and the results will help improve what it's like to work in the sector, tackle discrimination, and make the sector more attractive to new recruits. Make sure you and your employees are included in the Census, visit <u>census.spaceskills.org</u>. The census is open to anyone working in the space sector.
- b. Last week during Space-Comm Expo, the government announced its new <u>Space Industrial</u> <u>Plan</u> which is a joint civil-defence plan, establishing clear visions, missions, and actions to unlock growth and develop resilient space capabilities in the UK.
- c. Subsequently the UK Space Agency announced funding for <u>6 new projects</u> across the UK to boost growth. We're delighted to announce that #MidlandsSpaceCluster and the North West Space Cluster received funding for our Power4Space project which will develop novel power systems for deep space missions.

- e. We were proud to see the pictures of our <u>National Space Academy colleagues receiving</u>
 <u>their Queen's Anniversary Award</u> from Her Majesty The Queen and The Duke and Duchess of
 Gloucester at Buckingham Palace recently. Loughborough College and National Space
 Academy received the award for their ground-breaking Space Engineering programme which
 offers a world-class qualification to aspiring engineers, physicists, and astronauts. As the only
 course of its kind, the academically intensive programme blends A-Level Mathematics and ALevel Physics with a BTEC Level 3 National Diploma in Engineering, which is equivalent to four
